

Review of the Season

Scottish football was given a badly needed injection of hope at international level with victories over Wales, Northern Ireland, and England in the British Championship. The title 'Champions of Britain' is not one that we wear over-modestly, particularly in the company of Englishmen! However, though Willie Ormond moves into the World Cup arena at least with hope and new skills, club football is still in a state of dilemma.

The three-division experiment of 10, 14, and 14 has been retained at least for another season, but the clubs have decided to abolish the Spring Cup, and to make up for the loss of fixtures, First and Second Division teams will play each other three times instead of twice. This presents a problem in venue-selecting for the third match, but there was no other acceptable way out.

Premier Division elitists are, in the main, content, although worry lies in the stepped-up danger of costly relegation, for in the first furious fight to stay among the top ten there were no fewer than six genuine candidates for the drop.

Competition is certainly better, but no marked overall improvement in standard was apparent. This could come when players adjust properly to the fact that clubs in the Premier Division have to meet four times. There was a fear that this would diminish crowd interest but it hasn't happened.

Rangers won handsome victories at all levels. First of all, they beat Celtic 1-0 in the League Cup Final. It was a dream way to start the more earnest business of being the first Premier League champions. This they did with 54 points from the 36 games, scoring 61 goals and conceding 25. And they rounded off the season by romping over Hearts in the Scottish Cup Final.

It was a memorable treble and established hard-talking, demanding, ex-jungle fighter Jock Wallace as Scotland's 'Manager of the Year'. The Rangers performance also helped to win for captain John Greig the honour of being the first in 10 years to be picked twice by Scotland's football writers as their 'Player of the Year'. There are no guidelines for the sports writers, but most would confirm that they chose Greig because of his ability and leadership on the field rather than as a salute to the club.

Celtic, managed by Irishman Sean Fallon in the absence of Jock Stein, who spent the season recuperating from injuries sustained in a car crash, struggled to keep pace with Rangers but fell in the critical run-in despite the individual brilliance of skipper Kenny Dalglish and full back Danny McGrain.

One thing the Premier League didn't achieve, nor will it ever, was to quell the bitter rivalry between the two big Glasgow clubs. Both of them were well ahead of Hibs and Motherwell, the only two to make a real challenge. In five meetings between Rangers and Celtic, the Ibrox club won three by a single goal and the others were drawn. Yes, it was a bad season for Parkhead supporters. Stein, however, will be back for the new season to try to guide Celtic back to glory.

The only minor concession to 'outsiders' came with Hearts reaching the Cup Final. The Edinburgh club had to struggle to get there in replays against Montrose and Dumbarton, and they went to Hampden heavily tipped to lose. They didn't let the forecasters down.

Rangers' outstanding successes were achieved in quite different style to the techniques of Celtic, who switched players about in their champion times with an eye to the opposition. Jock Wallace took the view that he wanted a settled formation and, when he found it, two of Scotland's best players - striker Derek Parlane and full back Sandy Jardine - found themselves as substitutes. On the run-in, Rangers team rarely changed and teenaged Fifer Martin Henderson could hardly credit that he was in the side and

to Muirton Park fans was softened by expectancy, the shock of demotion rocked Dundee. It now remains to be seen if they can get back quickly. I think they will, and finance makes it essential. First Division football will cost the Dens Park club at least £100,000, for they will run with Premier Division over-heads and none of the benefits of games against Rangers and Celtic. That was why centre-half George Stewart, who handily lives in Edinburgh, was transferred to Hibs for £40,000. Manager Davie White regretted the signing as much as Eddie Turnbull at Easter Road welcomed it.

Partick Thistle and Kilmarnock are promoted to the Premier Division and it will be interesting to see how both meet the vastly stronger competition of the top ten. Kilmarnock appear to have more problems, for they are committed to part-time football, a policy they have not the slightest intention of changing.

Interestingly, ex-Celtic men run both teams - Bertie Auld (Thistle) and Willie Fernie (Killie). They have very different approaches to the game, although they are from the same 'school', so their progress will be followed closely.

Relegation to the Second Division for Clyde and Dunfermline were hard blows. Many thought it might even finish Clyde but, happily, this is not so. The most remarkable club were Clydebank with the witty, with-it director-manager Jack Steedman at the helm. They had a full-time staff in the Second Division and were rewarded by winning the championship and, of course, promotion, along with Raith Rovers.

Ironically, possibly the most exciting game was provided by the abortive Spring Cup. Airdrie beat Clydebank in the final at Firhill by 4-2, but only after extra time. It was a thrilling night but only about 5000 fans were there so the competition was doomed.

The price of Scottish football will be increased next season by 10p for the Premier and First Divisions with 5p added for the Second. This will make no difference at the gates, for Scottish football is the cheapest in Europe, which is why gate receipts at Wembley and Hampden compare so ridiculously.

However, clubs, apart from Rangers and Celtic will have to do more to make the top ten lively and sustain the interest. Hibs and Motherwell have the greatest responsibility, although the Fir Park club are progressive and can only now improve with experience. Edinburgh, with Hearts struggling miserably, is in the doldrums, and it will be up to Hibs to do something about it. Aberdeen, now bossed by Ally MacLeod, have been active on the transfer market. They have one of the best supports, but must produce the goods - and especially in the oil-boom area. MacLeod's former club, Ayr United, continue to do well against all-comers even though all their players have other jobs.

The new league set-up now moves into a more intensive trial stage than before. The big clubs are well aware of the mechanics in voting power which they delegated to the First and Second Divisions when the leagues were re-grouped. The 28, or most of them, need only gang up and they dictate the play. Significantly, the big men behind the scenes are being rejected for high office. The best legislator, Celtic chairman Desmond White, has twice been outvoted for the SFA treasurership - although he is an accountant as well as being the most experienced club director.

At international level, Willie Ormond will try to qualify Scotland for Argentina. He has refashioned the team by making Archie Gemmill captain and calling in Don Masson, a Banchory man who is having his best footballing days with Queens Park Rangers. So long as Scots are not bewildered by super-optimism we might just make it. That 2-1 win against England is still good for a bar debate, but the memory of it is not a World Cup credential. Qualifying for the world's major football tournament, establishing the three-league set-up as a workable permanency, and reappearing as a force in Europe are the three tasks facing Scotland.

It will need skill and nerve to bring off the treble, but the chance is undoubtedly there.
