

Review of Scottish Season

'Business as usual' more or less summarises the domestic season apart from the short-lived Spring Cup, dropped after one unsuccessful series and some rearrangements in the League and League Cup. There have been no major alterations and though many questions remained unanswered, the season was engrossing and entertaining overall.

The Premier Division produced interesting competition: in the early stages Dundee United held a good lead, with Aberdeen and Celtic in the hunt. As the season progressed, so did Celtic: the return of Jock Stein to full duty duly gave the team that touch of magic known so well; shrewd buying gave depth, stability and excitement to the team, and it was soon apparent that the expected and awaited rebuilding and reshaping had blossomed somewhat earlier than had been anticipated.

In the New Year it was soon clear that no one would catch Celtic. In the end, Rangers bull-dozed into second position, with Aberdeen and Dundee United finishing creditably, but unable to match the Old Firm. In the end it was Partick Thistle who slipped - well behind the leaders - unobtrusively into fifth position (Bertie Auld could well be satisfied with his first season in the Premier Division), whilst Hibernian had an uninspired programme, full of draws, in which their challenge subsided with barely a murmur.

Motherwell, too, failed to maintain their position. For a while they were among the relegation candidates, but, with many games in hand, they looked secure enough, and so it was in the end. This left Kilmarnock, seemingly doomed for most of the season, to be accompanied to the lower regions by either Ayr United or Hearts. Once more Ayr had a run of points when it mattered, and it was Hearts who could not raise their game. For the first time in their long history they were relegated, and they now look to Willie Ormond to see them back to the senior division in the shortest possible time.

The First Division was contested furiously at both ends. Dundee had hoped to bounce straight back to the Premier Division, but they found the competition severe and they faltered. The outstanding team was St Mirren, managed by the ebullient Alex Ferguson whose youngsters showed zest and invention, a desire to attack, and a pride in themselves. The crowds came flocking to Love Street, and there are many who hope that the team can hold its own and maintain its attractive play next season.

For the second season running Clydebank were promoted. They, too, have a side capable of finding a place in any company. It has been more than encouraging to see this team, which went full-time only last season, growing visibly in confidence and stature. A late run by Morton showed them to be a side to watch next year, though they came too late to put in a real challenge.

The bottom of this division produced a struggle which was resolved only on the last day of the season. Falkirk were early candidates for the drop, and doomed in the later stages, but a fascinating situation developed in April, and the last games were played with three teams knowing that one of them must go down with Falkirk: in the event it was Raith Rovers, who lost to Morton in a breathtaking finish by the odd goal in seven, whilst East Fife and St Johnstone scrambled clear.

Division Two was won by Stirling Albion, with Alloa joining them in Division One. Whether these two have the ability and know-how to survive in senior company will be seen next season, though some of the results against lowly teams during the season cannot fill their supporters with much confidence. On the face of it, there is not another Clydebank here. None the less, they are to be congratulated, Stirling for almost strolling into a vast lead and coasting home; and Alloa in a fine run in, when they held off solid challenges from Dunfermline and Stranraer, with Queen's Park not far away.

The number of teams in the Premier Division is still the question. Ten is not enough. The margin between a challenge for the top and the relegation zone is often wafer thin - teams cannot play their best if they do not know where they are! There has been much discussion and, indeed, there is no easy answer. A division with twelve teams, each playing each other four times, would give too many matches; but three fixtures between the teams means an unfair distribution of home and away matches; and there are snags in this - as has been seen in Divisions 1 and 2 this season. Eleven teams? It seems to introduce problems without really sorting others. Certainly the management has several proposals before it; no one seems entirely happy with the present arrangement, and a change looks likely for 1978-79.

The League Cup, too, has come in for some comment. The preliminary games at the beginning of the season in, good crowd weather, and when new-season enthusiasm is fresh, too often are meaningless except for the few: too often the section leader is

clear well before the end of the preliminaries. There are suggestions for the competition to be later in the season, with the League getting under way to start the season. Something may well come of this - especially after the despoiled League programme in December and January.

This year's League Cup winners were Aberdeen, who defeated Celtic (in their thirteenth consecutive League Cup final!) with an extra-time goal. If Aberdeen were a shade lucky to win the final, at least they thoroughly deserved success after a firmly waged campaign. Their thrashing of Rangers 5-1 in the semi-final is certainly a piquant memory of the season - particularly to Rangers. Ally MacLeod brought a breath of fresh west-wind to the north-east, and Aberdeen's achievements should well please him even if he was disappointed at not finishing with a higher points tally in the League. For the rest in the League Cup, Stirling Albion appeared to their best advantage, losing to Aberdeen only in a third game after a two-leg tie at 1-1. Clydebank, too, showed their maturity, with Rangers needing four games in the quarter-finals to dispose of them.

The Scottish Cup ended with a final between Celtic and Rangers, on live TV. It was a rotten day, and an undistinguished final on a pitch made difficult and slippery by frequent showers, but on the whole the right side won. So ended a frustrating season for Rangers. Nothing quite went right for them, and although they could play as well as ever, they were inconsistent. By their own high standards it was a poor season, with nothing to show for it. At the same time, a number of new players have emerged, and Rangers can look forward to the future with confidence.

Other sides to distinguish themselves in the Cup were East Fife and the Highland League club, Elgin City - who were doubtless delighted financially with their last game in the competition, at Ibrox. Dundee held Celtic in one semi-final for seven-eighths of the game, and finally went down to two Joe Craig goals, but they held their own as they so often do, in the Cup, and had accounted for Aberdeen in the previous round. Hearts, who lost to Rangers in the other semi-final, also reached the semi-final of the League Cup. What was it that went missing for them in the League?

The Scottish Cup sponsored and live on TV! Many faces looked glum, and indeed there were rumblings about having football on TV at all. The low attendance at the final was certainly a combination of the weather and the fact that the game was on TV; and it cannot be denied that TV diminishes the crowds who attend the matches generally, but it can too often be forgotten that the vastly increased unseen audience has benefits to the game, and thus to the clubs and the players.

Publicity brings money to all branches of the game, and TV coverage brings interest to the home and makes fans of people who would never dream of visiting a game. It has been the experience of some lesser known sports and games that TV coverage has produced widespread interest, and there seems little reason to suggest that football is the loser overall. Perhaps those who look to the TV as a reason for their lost numbers would do better to examine their own playing records: attractive and successful sides have had less trouble in keeping the turnstiles moving.

We cannot forget in this context the disturbing increase in bad behaviour in the crowds. Many are driven from the games by an unwillingness to risk being caught up in violence. The police do a wonderful job as far as they are allowed to, but they cannot succeed until they have full support from the clubs, the players, and the vast majority of the fans who go to the games to watch football. Some way must be found to remove from the crowds those whose delight is simply to disrupt whatever others are enjoying.

Willie Ormond has now ended a successful spell as manager of Scotland. He can look back on a distinguished record with the national side - a good and undefeated run in the last World Cup finals, a whitewash of the other countries in last year's home championship, and a series of sound results through the years, ending with a good win in a friendly against Sweden. His unassuming manner and complete dedication to the job have won him friends and much respect the world over; he has been an excellent ambassador for Scottish Football.

The international scene is now dominated by the qualifying stages for the next World Cup. We lost to Czechoslovakia after a good defensive first half, and then defeated Wales at Hampden. It looked as if we should have much difficulty in achieving a finals place, but Wales' magnificent victory over Czechoslovakia has made the section very open: somehow we can see our chances increased by this victory though both remaining games are hard enough, and neither of our opponents can be expected to give an inch. It is, however, at least up to us; we do not have to depend on the efforts of others in games in which we are not playing. This seems an opportune moment to wish the new team manager Ally MacLeod, and his players good luck and success in the coming year. He made an encouraging start, winning the British International Championship and enjoying a promising tour in South America.
