Football in Scotland continues to attract fewer spectators as the years go by. There are plenty who seek the reasons – the pull of television, the call of many other growing sports, fear of bad behaviour in the crowds, lack of reasonable facilities at the grounds, and so on. There are doubtless many reasons why our crowds decrease, and there is no immediate answer, no instant remedy which will bring the masses flocking back. This is a pity, for there was much to talk about in this season, much to discuss, much to enthuse about; and not a little to complain about, too.

The home season was full of incident. In the League Cup we had the unprecedented spectacle of two Dundee teams contesting the final at a Dundee ground and with a Dundee referee. That may seem a little parochial, but substitute 'Glasgow' for 'Dundee' – and how often have we seen that! Anyway, a Dundee final it was, and if United were well ahead on the day, nothing could take away from some stirring results from the First Division side, which included the dismissal of Aberdeen, then Premier Division leaders.

The Premier was in many ways the least interesting of the divisions: Aberdeen started in fine form, but they faltered in mid-stream and Celtic swept through to win by a substantial margin in the end. It did not pass without notice that Aberdeen's decline coincided almost with the injury to Gordon Strachan; and Aberdeen had other injury problems too. This undoubtedly upset their rhythm but it would be unfair to Celtic to make too much of this. After all, a team must have the resilience and depth to ride its injuries if it is to dwell in the halls of greatness. Celtic looked a good deal more mature this year, and deservedly won after the usual long and gruelling season. Dundee United, surely recognised now as one of our top teams, had the ability to demolish opposition, and on occasions they were unstoppable and even almost ready to receive the public plaudits of their perfection-demanding manager. Rangers were inconsistent in the League, and St Mirren never quite recaptured the previous season's high form. For the rest, it was mostly the scuttle away from relegation, but too soon it was obvious that Kilmarnock and Hearts were this year's appointed candidates and by Christmas they were almost resigned to it.

In Division One there were spirited struggles at both ends of the table. Hibs were out to assert their divine right to ascend and they did this in fairly regal fashion – though not without the odd stutter. Dundee started abysmally, and new manager Donald Mackay must have had nightmares as his team fumbled at the foot of the table. However, in time they began to gain some confidence and started to move upwards. For a long while Raith Rovers looked certainties for promotion, but there were other candidates – Ayr, Motherwell and, notably, St Johnstone. With only a few games left, there were still five teams in the hunt and all games were crucial. In the end Dundee just pipped St Johnstone, but they needed points from the last game on the last day to do it. In the relegation area, Berwick were always in danger; as the season progressed, Dunfermline and Stirling Albion were likely to join them. For a while, Berwick looked as if they might avoid the drop, but in the end they succumbed and were joined by Stirling, who failed to score in their last 13 League matches.

There are always many who like to see Queen's Park doing well. This was their season in the Second Division, and they finished as champions after leading the field for a considerable period. In fact, they were never out of the top group throughout the season. Good luck to them! They will need it in the new season, for undoubtedly this great amateur club with a great tradition will have again been the training ground for future professionals and will need to start team building all over again. Alloa looked strong for some time, Brechin had a long climb from the lower end to achieve third position at one time, but their challenge came to nothing, and Cowdenbeath all but reached promotion before losing the last vital game. It was left to Queen of the South to take five points from the final possible six and thus to clinch a berth in Division One. It was all interesting and exciting and, taken with the last-match decisions in the First Division, meant as good a last day to the League season as there has been.

So to the Cup. It is always good to see Highland League clubs making progress in this competition, and this year Buckie Thistle and Inverness Thistle both reached the third round, disposing of three Second Division clubs on the way. Ultimately Division One opposition proved too strong, but it is worth noting that more than 3,000 turned out to see Stirling win at Buckie. St Mirren made a quick exit at the hands of Dumbarton, and in the fourth round Clydebank beat Kilmarnock after two drawn games; but the real shock in that round was averted by seconds when Rangers scored an injury-time goal to draw 3-3 with St Johnstone – and subsequently won the replay comfortably. There were four First

Division teams in the last eight, but they were all eliminated. Rangers won a rather heavy semi-final against Morton, while Dundee United and Celtic needed two games before the former took the other place in the final. A no-score draw was barely a fair reflection of United's superiority in the final, though the game all but went Rangers' way in the end, the last-minute penalty being missed. The replay saw Rangers in a completely different mood. They took good chances when they came and cruised to victory, with United's rather light ball-players given little chance by a firm Rangers defence.

International results were, for the most part, encouraging and (dare it be said) there looks to be a reasonable chance of reaching Spain in 1982. Jock Stein wisely remains sphinx-like: some of his experiments – for example, at Swansea – did not work out well, but some new, young players were given their chance, and others reached full maturity in their international careers. The Wembley result was sweet, but we are under no delusions about the standards of World Cup opposition. There is hope, but this time the fans are keeping their feet firmly on the ground.

There have been more ominous rumbles about the demise of Hampden, and a decision looks to be not far away. I hope that matters may be satisfactorily concluded: international football without the home inspiration of Hampden is hard to think about and no other ready-made headquarters obviously available.

There did seem some chance of a reorganisation in the Leagues, and there were three proposals debated: in the end, however, we are back as we were. Can the game survive in its present shape? We shall see.
