Meadowbank's Walter Boyd scored the quickest goal of the round when he onened the scoring after only 51 seconds.

THREE GOALS FOR FORFAR IN FOUR MINUTES

Giant killers Brora Rangers proved that they had stamina as well as Cup potential, when enduring a five and a half hour marathon, against Second Division Montrose, before winning a second replay 5-2. Scotland's most northerly club possessed resilience too, for in that third game in Inverness, referee Colin Sinclair collapsed with hypathermia five minutes from the end.

The scoring highlight of the round again came from Cup specialists Forfar, who knocked in three inside four first half minutes to dispose of their Highland League opponents Inverness Caley.

However Brora will not be alone in the third round. for Elgin City joined them by virtue of a fine second half showing against East of Scotland League side Gala Fairydean. The men from the north scuttled their far travelled opponents 5-2, their goals coming in a 29 minute second half spell

ST MIRREN KNOCK OUT DUNDEE UNITED AGAIN

First Division Partick Thistle required seven hours of action, before they could make Premier League strugglers Kilmarnock concede defeat, with 20 year old Maurice Johnston breaking the dealock in the third replay. Cup holders Aberdeen gave notice that they were not to surrender the trophy, without a struggle, when having four individual scorers in an emphatic win at Easter Road. It was disappointing to note that the game produced the biggest crowd of the round - only 14,289.

Perhaps the fact that Rangers, Celtic and Dundee were, like Aberdeen, away from home contributed and it was United's trip to Love Street that was to see the first of the big guns depart.

Doug Somner snatched the vital goal that meant the Tannadice team were out on the same venue as last year. although on that occasion it was in the quarter final

stage.

The financial well being of the competition was still assured however, when Celtic were comfortable winners at Clydebank and their Old Firm rivals Rangers overcame the stuffy challenge of Falkirk at Brockville.

Peter Weir replaced the concussed Neale Cooper in the 42nd minute, and made his introduction decisive when heading the winner 23 minutes later. Across the city, Rangers met in a repeat of a clash at the same stage two seasons ago. Sandy Clark had Rangers in front in the first game, until a tragic late own goal by Craig Paterson, preserved St Mirren's link with the competition. The tie switched from Parkhead to Hampden for the replay, and after both sides can claim they had chances to win the right to meet Aberdeen, Clark popped up one minute from the end of extra time, to more than justify the £165,000 it cost to bring him back to Scotland from West Ham United.

Alec Ferguson's men dragged up one last push and when Mark McGhee's cross from the right took an unkind deflection off Craig Paterson, Eric Black who had been involved in the build up outside the box, finished his run by placing the decisive header wide of Peter McCloy. Although the partially refurbished stadium had only 62,979 fans in its 75,800 places, that represented an increase of 9191, when the same two teams met twelve months earlier. Further evidence that the Scottish game is pushing back what had earlier seemed to ean unstoppable slide in appeal.
