FA Cup First Round

ELEVEN 'NON-LEAGUE' CLUBS MOVE ON

It is no longer a surprise if **Altrincham** beat a League club, so their progress into the Second Round at the expense of lowly **Rochdale** didn't hit the headlines. Unfortunately both sides had two players sent off and this sad feature dominated the round as a total of twelve players failed to hear the final whistle. A very unwelcome record!

The scourge of the Football League, the visiting hooligan, ruined the big day for two 'non league' clubs, **Wokingham** and **Slough Town**. However, their results proved some sort of compensation as **Cardiff** were held at **Wokingham** and **Millwall** were beaten at **Slough**.

Great results were achieved by **Bishop's Cleeve** at **Reading** and **Northwich Victoria** who beat **Chester** in a home replay. While probably the only player/groundsman in the cup, **Chris Cook**, scored two match winning goals for **Boston United** in their 3-1 win over **Crewe**.

Little **Wimborne** from the Western League's lower division were the real minnows and they enjoyed their day out at **Aldershot**, while 'non-League' giants **Wycombe Wanderers** were given a standing ovation at **Bournemouth** where **Bristol Rovers** just scraped in 1-0.

Tranmere Rovers, in desperate financial trouble, achieved an all important victory over **Scarborough** and little **Shepherd's Charterhouse** from the new Northern Counties (East) created club history with a visit to famous **Preston North End**.

Two local 'derbies' attracted good attendances, 9,152 at **Hull** for the visit of **Sheffield United** and 10,202 at **Plymouth** to watch the home side's 2-0 victory over **Exeter City**, while **Portsmouth** also had over 10,000 at **Fratton Park** to see **Billy Rafferty** score a hat trick in their 4-1 defeat of **Hereford United**.

Eighty clubs took part in this round, 24 from the Third Division, 24 from the Fourth Division, 14 Alliance, 8 Isthmian, 3 Northern Premier League, 2 Southern League, and one each from the Northern, Western, United Counties, Northern Counties (East) and the North West Counties Leagues.

FA Cup Second Round

WEYMOUTH WIN AT CARDIFF

The forty clubs competing in this round were made up of 17 Third Division clubs, 12 from the Fourth Division, 6 Alliance clubs, 4 Isthmians and North Shields from The Northern League.

The heroes of the day were undoubtedly Weymouth who trailed Cardiff City by two goals at half time but came back to win 3-2, a great effort in any game, but against a team confidently placed near the top of Division Three; it really was a bit special!

Lyndon Lynch, a Marvin Hagler 'look alike', scored three at Slough to give Bishop's Stortford a place in the Third Round draw and Worcester City came from behind to beat Wrexham with two goals from Paul Moss.

Memories of the Tom Finney and Stanley Matthews era were rekindled as Preston beat Blackpool 2-1 in front of 14,008 and despite another good attendance at Portsmouth (13,250), visiting Aldershot achieved a surprise 3-1 victory.

Tranmere Rovers beat Telford in a replay and grabbed themselves a possible lifeline, if the draw proved kind to them, while Boston United qualified for a replay at Bramall Lane, which was lucrative but not productive and Altrincham failed to reach the Third Round for the first time in five years when they lost 0-1 to a very good Huddersfield side.

There they were again, having contested the Milk Cup two legged semi-final, United and Arsenal were paired together in the 'red corner' while out of the 'blue corner' Brighton and Sheffield Wednesday prepared for the fight of their lives.

Manchester United's quite brilliant winning goal from a limping Frank Stapleton, made by substitute Lou Macari during the minute he was on the field, was a

quite undeserved disappointment for Everton and in particular Jim Arnold, their goalkeeper, who certainly had earned a replay. But that is Cup Football!

On the south coast, the cup tie between two First Division clubs with relegation problems produced an exciting spectacle but 'some terrible football', in the words of an exultant Jimmy Melia. His match winner with a controversial goal was of course - Jimmy Case.

One Second Division club was guaranteed a place in the Semi-Finals, but after an excellent, evenly fought tie at Turf Moor, Wednesday enjoyed 'one of those nights' when everything went right and in front of 41,731 spectators, reminding Hillsborough of the good old days, Burnley were swamped by five goals. Gary Megson, son of Don, who had captained Wednesday at Wembley in 1966, kept his record of scoring in each round, and manager Jackie Charlton's smile covered the Pennines!

United's all round dominance was finally rewarded with an excellent goal after just five minutes of the second half. McQueen, quite outstanding in the air, powered a clearance to Ashley Grimes on the left wing, whose early centre was met superbly by Bryan Robson. A quick turn away from Talbot and a crisp angled shot across Wood was too good for the Arsenal defence.

Lifted by this success it was all United and it came as no surprise when Norman Whiteside volleyed home an Albiston cross in the 70th minute in superb fashion. Arsenal battled bravely to the end of an excellent Semi-Final but United deservedly qualified for their second Wembley Cup Final of the season.

Wednesday came back well after the interval and the speedy Bannister caused problems before Ante Mirocevic knocked in a rebound following a Megson free kick in the 56th minute.

Northern hopes were soon shattered however as, with 12 minutes to go Case sent Smith away and after a goalmouth scramble, Mike Robson scored the vital match winner. Before the final whistle, the Brighton defence performed heroics as Foster cleared off the line with an overhead kick and Graham Moseley made two excellent saves.

The pure joy expressed by Jimmy Melia at the end must have warmed the hearts of all who had worried about the game losing its romance. Second Division Sheffield Wednesday had battled well but relegation candidates Brighton had qualified to play in an FA Cup Final at Wembley for the first time in their history.

So after 14 minutes a Brighton goal through Gordon Smith was well deserved as he headed in a flighted centre from Howlett.

Slowly but surely United played themselves back into the game and both Ramsey and Robinson cleared off the line. Brighton also had their chances but just ten minutes after half time, Whiteside touched on a Duxbury cross and there was Stapleton to score at the far post. It was sad that Ramsey, who had just received a bad knock from Whiteside was not fit enough to cover correctly during this attack and subsequently left the field to be substituted by Ryan.

It looked as if the Seaside's chance had gone and when Ray Wilkins curled in a superb goal to give United the lead after 73 minutes no one gave Jimmy Melia's men much chance of coming back. But with just three minutes to go a Jimmy Case corner was pulled back to Grealish and the skipper's stab into the box was pounced upon by Brighton's hero, Stevens, and suddenly Brighton had been reprieved.

With both sides tired after a gruelling but exciting match it was not surprising that no goals came in extra time. Brighton did have the last chance however as Mick Robinson, battling to the last, forced his way through to set up a great chance for Smith. The world seemed to stand still as the hero of the first half saw Bailey save his shot bravely and we all looked forward to Thursday's replay.

The return of skipper Foster should have helped Brighton and Hove Albion in this replay but perhaps the splitting of the successful Stevens-Gating partnership unsettled the defence. Whatever the cause, however, it was clear to see that an inspired United were in no mood to give the opposition a second chance.

On Sir Matt Busby's 74th birthday, in a carnival atmosphere where everyone seemed to be enjoying themselves, the red shirts of Manchester were everywhere. Their least experienced player, Davies, again shone and Bryan Robson once more proved to be his side's inspiration.

Mid-way through the first half, two goals in four minutes ensured the cup would be on its way to Lancashire. Firstly Albiston and Davies combined to give Robson a straightforward goal and then Muhren's corner kick was touched on by Davies for Whiteside to power in the second. The young Irishman had now scored at Wembley in both The Milk Cup and FA Cup Finals in his first full season!

Jimmy Case saw his deflected shot well saved under the crossbar by Bailey as the first half came to a close but it was skipper Robson again who virtually had the game sewn up as he pounced on a Stapleton header to score from close range and send his side in with a three-goal advantage.

The second half saw a more relaxed game as Brighton realized their chances had gone and United were happy with their lead. However, a penalty after 62 minutes by Muhren after Stevens had held Robson, gave United the biggest Cup Final victory at Wembley but Brighton were not disgraced. Indeed they received a well deserved ovation following their fine contribution to two excellent cup ties, for which both clubs deserve credit for the quality, excitement and sportsmanship shown.
