The Scottish Football League was reconstructed into three divisions at the end of the 1974-75 season, so the usual relegation statistics do not apply.

THE SCOTTISH SEASON 1984-85

So much happened elsewhere to cloud the end of the season that one tends to forget what an interesting one it was.

Early on the newly reorganised Skol Cup led to some excellent matches. The new form of straight knock-out proved popular with the public and led to some notable early scalps: Cowdenbeath beat Partick Thistle, Meadowbank Thistle beat Morton, and then, biggest of all, Airdrieonians beat Aberdeen 3-1. Cowdenbeath progressed next by taking St Mirren while Meadowbank defeated Hibernian. In the next round Rangers disposed of Cowdenbeath, and then, in the semi-finals - for some reason the only round with two legs - they finally removed the gallant Meadowbank. Late in October Iain Ferguson, an expensive off-season buy from Dundee, scored the only goal of the final against Dundee United to give Rangers hope of a fully successful season.

Meantime Aberdeen had been consolidating a substantial lead in the Premier Division. They led from start to finish, and, although there was a minor stutter round the turn of the year, they never looked to be giving much of a chance to Celtic, who were the only club within range. Aberdeen's young players continue to thrive and to show a class which must give Alex Ferguson much cause for satisfaction, and few sleepless nights. It was no coincidence that the team did not look so good when Alex McLeish was off injured. Willie Miller is rarely at a loss, but he is always happier when hunting with Jim Leighton and McLeish. Eric Black, who can look a bit portly in profile, continues to use his head to advantage, and Billy Stark, often cast in the role of whipping boy, looks steadier and more sharp with every game. The icing on the cake was Frank McDougall, who came fully up to expectations; even so, plain cake was sometimes the requirement, and it was a good mixture. Celtic had some fine performances, but never quite looked to have what was needed to catch the Dons. Rangers, after a reasonable if rather goalless start, faded away after their Skol Cup win, and were soon overtaken by a Dundee United team which set itself an uphill task after taking only nine points from their first 10 games. United, for all that they beat the Dons twice in 10 days, and had a host of other superb performances, failed to get their hands on any of the loot this season. They deserved much better, but how often is this the case! The division was divided into three. The lower section - Morton, Dumbarton and Hibernian - were busy trying to avoid relegation: Morton were soon in trouble, and by the turn of the year without much hope. Dumbarton, who had been most people's selection to go down, showed a great deal of fight, and achieved some unexpected results, but in the end Hibs proved to have too much stamina, and the Sons went down. St Mirren, Dundee (who at one time looked possible relegation candidates, yet did not play like it) and Hearts spent the last part of the season looking for the fifth UEFA Cup place; it did add spice to an otherwise rather dull portion of the league; the race was won by the Buddies. Aberdeen, incidentally, reached a record number of points in the division, while Morton had the less enviable distinction of being the first to have a hundred league goals against.

This winter was very open, and there were few postponements until January; even then, most games could be played, and the backlog never reached serious proportions; the season finished with 36 of the 38 clubs playing their last three games on the dates planned. The one exception was a drawn Old Firm game, which finally clinched the championship for Aberdeen. It was curious that some of the worst weather came in late March and even early April; when is this suggested close season to be? We heard very little of this one this year.

In Division I there was a magnificently tight season, with very little between the middle large bunch and the top and bottom teams for much of the time. Airdrie had a good run and led the field confidently into the new year. Then they relapsed and allowed the solid Motherwell, who were also shining in the Cup, to inch ahead; while Clydebank also showed tenacity in maintaining second place at the end. Falkirk looked good for advancement and finished third; they had talent all round, and could rue some rather carelessly dropped points. With few points separating the big batch in the middle, the foot of this division was for a long time tenanted by some famous clubs: Partick Thistle and Kilmarnock and St Johnstone were all in danger, and though in the end Partick climbed fairly clear, Killie were pushed to the end, and St Johnstone failed to make it - thus having the unfortunate record of a double descent in successive seasons. Meadowbank, who won their last five away games, none the less go down. In this they are a bit unlucky, but someone had to go, and it was very tight.

Now to Division II, where Dunfermline seemed to be carrying all before them: Montrose

and Alloa kept steadily after them, giving little away. In the latter stages, the Gable Endies, under the dynamic leadership of Ian Stewart, confidently took the top place – and now join Brechin and Forfar in a formidable challenge from the north-east in this division. Dunfermline had their chance to edge ahead of Alloa when the two met in their penultimate fixture; but, in a tense no-score draw in front of large crowd, Alloa just held on, leaving the Pars with it all to do again.

The Cup produced some early fireworks, with Stirling Albion firing in 20 goals against Selkirk – a record for the century. This was the year of the Highland League clubs: Keith, this season's winners of the League, lost to Ayr United in the third round; Inverness Caley, having disposed of Berwick Rangers at the third attempt in the second round, made a visit to Edinburgh where Hearts, after spirited resistance from Caley for a while, proved too strong. Another club to have difficulties in the north was Kilmarnock: they found Inverness Thistle a handful, and succumbed in the second half to the obvious disgust of their supporters. Thistle now faced the mighty Celtic at Parkhead in the fourth round: it was an encounter which captured popular imagination, and, though Celtic were very comfortable winners, Thistle came out of it with much credit. Motherwell came through some difficult games to the semi-final, where they very nearly gave Celtic a nasty shock; in the replay, Celtic won easily in the end, while Dundee United, also in a replay, put paid to Aberdeen's dreams of a fourth successive Cup win. The final between Celtic and Dundee United was not a great game, but it did produce some great goals: United scored first, and then looked to be in complete command; an inch-perfect dead ball goal from Davie Provan brought the scores equal, however, and when man-of-the-match Roy Aitken's cross was expertly headed by Frank McGarvey to put Celtic into the lead, United had no reply.

In Europe we did not do so well this year. Aberdeen made a meal of their first game, and in the second were unfortunate to lose on penalties – though they should never have been in the position of having to play them. A pity, but by then they had not quite settled after the loss of key players, and they look a much better bet now. Celtic were involved in the extraordinary extra game with Rapide after their magnificent win at Parkhead had been cruelly washed out by a couple of thoughtless 'fans'. I suppose that is the word one must use for them. It seemed a reasonable decision by UEFA at the time, though subsequent similar events in other countries, which escaped penalty, and a barrage of fruit on our goalkeeper in Spain, make one wonder what the international bodies think they are about. Dundee United eventually came up against Manchester United in the UEFA Cup, and this crunch fixture led to a wonderful display by the Dundee team in Manchester – in which Player of the Year Hamish McAlpine surely booked his title with an outstanding performance. All even. At Tannadice there was another superb game, with Manchester United showing devastating form in winning and Dundee United in no way disgraced. Rangers and Hearts, our other representatives, both went out early, but not without giving a good showing.

The international season started with a flurry and high hopes: with victories over Yugoslavia (friendly), with six goals netted, followed by Iceland and Spain in the World Cup qualifiers, we were an eager and adept team; with a real hungry look. As the winter drew on, we set off for Spain, and were not altogether lucky in just losing by the only goal. Worse followed, for an inept display found us losing to Wales by the same score at Hampden in March: a good Welsh goal there was, but also some dreadful misses on our part. After a satisfactory result in the game with England (for the Rous Cup), we left for the important game in Iceland, and were not a little lucky to come out of this as winners. Spain look set to qualify in our group, and now the return match with Wales will settle which of us goes into the play-off. It all looked so different back in the autumn; but, after a long season, what can be expected from jaded and out of sorts players – especially when we are dependent on the English league and UEFA so that we cannot have the players we want readily available for vital games. It leaves one speechless, which is probably just as well.
